## Judging

Essays will be judged on creativity, critical thinking and quality of writing, both with regard to content and form.

Rules

- Entrant must be in high school (Grades 9-12)
- Essay must include a cover sheet with entrants name, phone number, alternate contact number and email address; the name and address of your high school; current grade level and the year you will graduate from high school.
- Essay must be no fewer than 500 and no more than 1,000 words in length, typewritten, double-space using Times New Roman font.
- Essay must be solely the work of the entrant.

- Essay should be received by midnight on February 17, 2017
- Decisions of the judges are final.
- All entries become the property of Black Family Technology Awareness Association of Kansas City and will NOT be returned.
- Finalist will be notified no later than February 22, 2017 via telephone and/or email.
